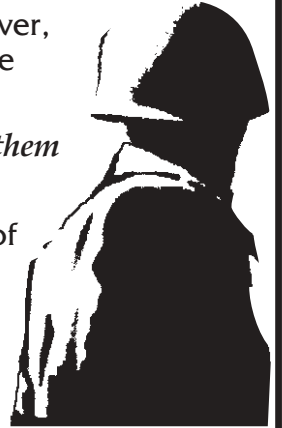


Sample Outreach/Educational Tools from Project YANO

Outreach/Educational Materials

A. ___ -English ___ -Spanish **Alternative Resources Directory.*** Created for San Diego area: brochure listing non-military job training and youth employment programs; some student aid information (for California). (5/99) 50¢.

B. ___ -English ___ -Spanish **The Military's Not Just a Job...It's Eight Years of Your Life.*** Brochure detailing problems with military careers and enlistment; questions to ask a recruiter; civilian job hunting tips. (Eng.-1/02, Span.-8/02) 50¢.

C. ___ **Careers in Peacemaking and Social Change.*** Brochure discussing how to make a career choice that is compatible with both income needs and ethical values (major revision 3/97). 50¢.

D. ___ **On Conscientious Objection & Guidance Responsibilities/Student Questionnaire.*** Sheet explaining conscientious objection and reasons why school guidance offices should provide students with C.O. information; questionnaire to help students explore whether their beliefs might conflict with enlisting or being drafted. 45¢.

E. ___ **Adventures Working for Peace & Social Justice.*** List of sample projects offering youths opportunities to travel, do challenging work, help people in

need and work for change; national and international. Living allowances and benefits vary. (7/97) 50¢.

F. ___ **Examples of Careers in Peacemaking and Community Activism.*** Sample list of careers for young people to consider; suggests how the jobs can be used to work for peace and social justice and notes some skills needed for each career. Spanish/English. (3/97) 45¢.

G. ___ **1985 H.S. Counselor Outreach Campaign Report.** Report on early campaign directed toward high school counselors in the San Diego area. Includes some attachments and everything in A-E above. 14 pages of text plus sample brochures. \$5.50.

H. ___ **Teacher Outreach Packet.*** Sent to San Diego area teachers: cover letter; resource order form; information on the video, "It's Not Just a Job;" and a list of questions addressed by Project YANO classroom speakers. 55¢.

I. ___ **Sample High School Newspaper Ads.** Includes one counter-recruitment ad developed by Project YANO and one based on an ad from CCCO. 45¢.

J. ___ **Sample Materials for Anti-ASVAB Campaign.** Includes a letter sent to San Diego principals and counselors, a copy of an ASVAB critique from a professional journal, and a news release sent to high school student newspapers. (11/89) \$1.50.

K. ___ **So You Want to Be a Man.*** Speaks to those who think the military is the best way to prove one's manhood. Spanish/English, half-page flier. ('01) 30¢.

School Access

M. San Diego CARD v. Governing Board of the Grossmont Union High School District.* 1986 decision by the Federal Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit (Western U.S.), holding that the subject of military service is not an economic issue, but is "primarily political." Schools cannot exclude opposing viewpoints if a forum on military service has been created for proponents of the military (i.e., military recruiters or the Selective Service System). Useful for convincing schools to grant equal access to groups presenting alternative views. 16 pages. \$3.00.

N. Using Equal Access to Counter Militarism in High Schools. Report on Project YANO's efforts to gain access to schools in San Diego County from 1984 to 1995. Discusses outreach strategies, legal basis for equal access, lessons learned by activists. Key correspondence with school districts is included in appendix. Very useful for getting a school outreach program started. (Revised 2/02: passage of federal law mandating military access to student lists) 41 pages. \$6.25.

O. Options for Controlling Military Recruiter Access to Secondary Schools and Students.* Memo on the recruiter access law passed with the No Child Left Behind Act in 2002. Discusses school policies that can still restrict recruiter access to student lists, etc. (1/28/03) 45¢.

P. Notice to parents: keeping schools from releasing student names to the military.* Includes form letter that can be used to withhold information from recruiters. Spanish/English. (3/4/03). 45¢.

Q. Some Objections to JROTC. Summary of some arguments against JROTC. Includes sample excerpts from Navy, Army & Air Force JROTC textbooks. 45¢.

R. JROTC and the San Diego Unified School District. Fact sheet with general background and anti-JROTC arguments prepared for local San Diego use. (2/95) 45¢.

S. San Diego Unified School District Review of Air Force JROTC Curriculum Materials. Report from official review committee which found textbooks to be inaccurate, distorted, insensitive to women, etc. (1994) 60¢.

T. JROTC Textbook Excerpts. Master compilation: hundreds of excerpts from Army, Navy and Air Force JROTC curriculum materials, illustrating historical inaccuracies, one-sided presentations of political issues, militaristic values, recruitment propaganda, racism, etc. Includes page references and some commentary

by our reviewers. (Rev. 7/95 w/changes to Army's LET 2; further updates expected in 2003) 52 pages. \$4.50.

U. Is JROTC More Expensive for Local Schools?* Uses personnel budget from one school to illustrate how JROTC can cost more than other educational programs. (1/24/96) 45¢.

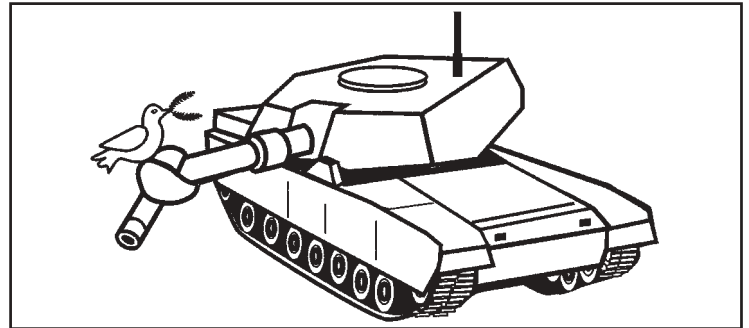
