Why Power Vote, why now?

2008 is a turning point. We are electing everyone from city council members to our next president. There will be a sea change in 2008, and Youth are turning out to vote in record numbers. Youth will represent 25% of the electorate and will be voting on issues like the economy, health, and the war, all of which are intimately connected to our country's dirty energy dependence. By elevating climate change and clean, just energy alternatives in this election we will be able to build healthier communities, creates millions of good, green jobs, and stop resource wars. What happens in the next 4 years will decide our future.

Our generation needs a brand new vision for our future. We need to lead the world towards a just, clean energy economy that moves beyond dirty energy, creates green jobs for all, and secures our climate. Now is the time. We are the ones we have been waiting for.

How will we succeed?

We will push every candidate to be a climate hero. Politicians are most open to changing their stances during election season. By linking our local campaigns to the election and planning high profile media events, the climate movement will be covered in the press like never before.

We will talk to one million of our peers and grow our movement. Our peers are more open to talking politics during election season than at any other time - so let's talk about climate and green jobs for all. We will use the Power Vote Pledge to talk to one million of our peers about connecting the issues we care about and getting involved to create lasting change. Using the election to do large scale grassroots organizing will pay off by swelling our numbers for all our future climate work. Thousands of young people are already fighting climate change and creating clean, just energy solutions. We need millions to join of us if we are going to win. In 2008, we will build our movement and our power.

GREEN JOBS NOW

Invest in millions of new green jobs, strengthen the American middle class and create new pathways out of poverty for millions more. By retooling our factories, revamping our schools, and rebuilding our communities, we can create a sustainable, just, and prosperous future for all.

INVEST IN A CLEAN ENERGY ECONOMY

Unleash American ingenuity and launch a new wave of affordable clean energy technology. We need more federal and private investments in public transit, ultra-efficient vehicles, and renewable energy like wind and solar.

CUT GLOBAL WARMING POLLUTION NOW

To ensure our health, prosperity, and security, scientists tell us we must rapidly drive US global warming pollution towards zero. We can and must accomplish this transition to a clean energy future in an equitable and just manner.

END OUR DEPENDENCE ON DIRTY ENERGY

Enact an immediate moratorium on new coal, oil, natural gas, and nuclear plant construction and infrastructure, while phasing out existing plants and fossil fuel extraction and ensuring a just transition for the workforce and communities.

RE-ENGAGE AS A LEADER IN THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY

Global warming requires a global solution. We must shift the focus of American foreign policy from military intervention to international cooperation and join the world in pursuing peace and international development, thereby offering assistance to vulnerable and impacted communities.

TAKE DIRTY MONEY OUT OF POLITICS

It's time to make government accountable to "We the People." Put voters first and refuse campaign contributions from dirty energy interests.

What will Power Vote be like next fall?

Power Vote will build off and strengthen the incredible organizing that is already going on around the country. Over the course of a few months we'll strengthen and integrate our local campaigns so that come Election Day, we have enough power that we can't be ignored. Here are a couple of examples:

- Building off their success at passing a state-wide carbon neutrality policy for public universities, the Maryland Student Climate Coalition is planning on extending their reach onto more campuses and continuing to build support for state climate action.
- Students in Florida working with the Southern Energy Network are going to continue the battle against nuclear energy by building their presence throughout the state and making sure their call rings loud and clear: "No Coal, No Nukes, No Kidding!"

We'll be getting the word out about Power Vote by having millions of conversations with our peers about the issues that matter to us, by encouraging them to stay involved, by hosting big events, bird dogging and demonstrating. Get ready, it's going to be action packed!

Be a Power Vote Campus Coordinator

On campuses and in communities around the country young people are taking the lead getting clean energy solutions and green jobs now. Power Vote campus and community coordinators will be gathering this August to train and plan for Power Vote this fall. Being a campus or community coordinator will involve coordinating other youth and students to run Power Vote. Being a Power Vote coordinator will include:

- Taking time to plan Power Vote on the ground, setting strategy and goals
- Creating a plan to reach 50%, 60%, 70% (!!) of your campus
- · Coordinating and training volunteers and organizers
- Planning events like candidate forums, political street theatre, and actions
- Mobilizing people to bird-dog a candidate anytime they are in your area

Attend the MEGA Training Camp this summer

From August 13th-17th, Energy Action and its partners will be hosting the Power Vote MEGA Training Camp to equip youth leaders with the skills and resources necessary to run Power Vote on campuses and in communities around the country. Student leaders will leave the training prepared to build an unstoppable ground force this November and beyond.

The training will focus on the critical skills for electoral and issue advocacy organizing, including:

- Developing and delivering a winning message
- Generating quality earned media coverage
- Grassroots voter contact tactics and phases (registration, education and GOTV)
- Volunteer recruitment and management
- Leadership development
- Effective coalition-building
- · Candidate education and accountability
- Bird dogging and creative actions
- Anti-Oppression and diversity
- Movement strategy: our long-term plan to win!



Additionally, training participants will leave with a clear understanding of the Power Vote program goals, timeline, implementation plan, and their role in making it happen. The training will be highly interactive with a great emphasis on actually testing out the skills with time for discussion and feedback. Skills will be applicable for climate campaigning throughout the year.

Working on Power Vote over the summer

It's not too early to start running Power Vote. You can even start organizing for Power Vote before your first year on campus! Here are some ideas to get you started, but this is only an initial list. Be creative and get started!

- Talk to your entire group about Power Vote and making it a priority for next year. Don't have a group? Talk to some friends about starting one!
- Plan a state or campus strategy session in early June with other students who are around for the summer. Got a state network? Get in touch and figure out how you can coordinate across the state. Check out http://www.energyactioncoalition.org/whoweare/movement/leaders to see if there's an organizer in your area to help you get your state network onboard.
- Start outreaching to other student orgs to build a coalition around voter outreach. Find collaborative ways to work together.
- Lots of students are in-school during the summer outreach to them with tabling and class raps. Sports teams are also often on-campus, get in touch with them to work together.
- Prepare for first-year orientation and move-in. Make sure you have everything you need to get the semester off to a strong start. Aim to get all the first-year students signed up for Power Vote at orientation and think that your group is the hottest stuff on campus.

- Build a HUGE network of professors and staff who want to help with Power Vote.
- Organize volunteers to table at concerts and festivals. This is a great way to build buzz about your local campaign. Bring Power Vote to where people are gathering!
- Build the buzz on Facebook and Myspace! Start your campus Power Vote Facebook group and fan the Power Vote page
 in the summer and begin outreaching to incoming freshmen. We all know incoming freshmen make friends on Facebook
 before making friends on campus, why wouldn't they also get involved on Facebook before getting involved on campus?
- Make some cool YouTube videos to visually show people what you are working on.
